



The concept of Cosmic Leap seems pretty simple at first, all you have to do it jump around a bunch of planets and make your way towards your getaway spaceship while encountering several obsacles and enemies. I would not recommend this game for people who lack patience as you will end up punching the table many times thanks to unresponsive controls. Over time I somewhat got used to them but they are very difficult to master. This game poses a real challenge if you decide to complete both objectives (finish a level in time and collect all the coins within). There are also a couple of bugs where the game freezes upon opening Steam Overlay and when you fiddle with the screen resolution. On the other hand, Cosmic Leap has impressive visuals and undisturbing but yet good soundtrack. Also, try and find a steam coupon for this game if you can. 7V10. Fun game with a nice atmosphere. The combat gets a bit repetitive after a while but the other aspects of the game makes it worth playing through.. Bought this route at a steep discount, tried to find it when I started up the game and no where to be found. This game is unworthy of being produced. I recommend avoiding this game at all cost unless you love spending 10 hours just laying 50 feet of track.. Not as long or as good (puzzle wise, I feel the story is as strong as ever) as the first chapter but is still very good.

A great game that you should play if you enjoy train management. Game crashes every time I try to start it.. Good stuff.. I bought this out of nostlgic memories of Fantasy General as it is a very similar game (if not a direct fan-made remake). Much nicer game graphics but lacking the beautiful artwork and musical score that made Fantasy General stand out for me. In terms of the gameplay I would say this game is one of the most frustrating strategy games I have ever played. The (unecessary) time contraints mean that I had to be constantly overextending which got me punished by the AI 9 times out of 10. I probably spent more time reloading\restarting more than playing - I think the last mission of the Human campaign (I haven't bothered with the others) took me about 12 hours and 4 restarts. I felt quite traumatized by the end.

The twists to the quests that occur at the end meant that thought I had finished the mission only to find I then had to unexpectedly get a particular hero to a specific location to win - this guy might be on the other side of the map depending on how I split my troops up at the start; so time to restart again... Similarly if I place all my units down at the start I might suddenly find that I need to defend somewhere on the other side of the map and realize that I should have reserved some units for this and needed to restart.. Absolutely broken platformer with rubbish controls! I've really enjoyed flying through platforms or not being able to jump at all in some cases. And what about that train stage? It's borderline impossible to complete! On the plus side, the sprites are fine, but that's it. Overall, avoid at all costs!

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
